

### **Pension Application for Drury Hearn**

W.3548

Letter dated March 16, 1927.

I have to advise you from the papers in the Revolutionary War pension claim W.3548, it appears that Drury Hearn enlisted May 15, 1776 and served as a private Captain James Emmet's Company, Colonel Jethro Sumner's Third North Carolina Regiment, he was in the battles of Brandywine, Germantown, Monmouth, and was discharged November 10, 1778; after which he was discharged November 10, 1778; after which he was at the Siege of Charleston, was taken prisoner, and then paroled.

He was allowed pension on his application executed November 1, 1832, while a resident of Edgefield District, South Carolina, aged seventy-seven years and two months.

He died October 14, 1840 at Sleepy Creek, Edgefield District, South Carolina.

Soldier married May 17, 1814 in Edgefield District, South Carolina, Keren or Karen Bledsoe. She was allowed pension on her application executed May 16, 1853, while a resident of Sleepy Creek, South Carolina, aged sixty-four years.

There is no data on file relative to children.
