

**Pension Application for Paul Hebert**

W.23264 (Widow: Angelique) Paul died April 1, 1809. There is a marriage certificate in the folder (I think), but it is in French. Angelique stated Paul was a Canadian Refugee.

Clinton County SS

Basil Nadau of Chazy being duly sworn maketh oath and saith that he was in the American Service in Canada in the [year] 1775 & was at Quebec under Montgomery that in the summer 1776 he retreated from Canada with other refugees & went to Albany. That in the fall of 1776 he listed, during the war in Captain Lorent Oliver's Company, Colonel Moses Hazens Regiment, as Sergeant of Infantry and served as a Sergeant in the same Company to the close of the revolutionary War.

That Paul Hebert was a soldier in the same Company of Captain Lorent Oliver and served to the end of the war. Deponent does not recollect exactly at [what] time the said Paul joined the said Company but he recollects that he was mustered in said company in the spring of the year 1777 at Princeton in New Jersey. That he served to the close of the war and was discharged together with deponent near Newburgh in the State of New York in the summer of 1783 and further deponent saith not. (Signed with his mark) Basil Nadeau
