

Pension Application for William Hebron

His name appears on a list of applicants for invalid pension returned by the District Court for the District of Pennsylvania, submitted to the House of Representatives by the Secretary of War on April 25, 1794, and printed in the American State Papers, class 8, page 98.

Rank: Sergeant.

Regt: 3d New York

Disability: Hurt by a branch of a crooked tree, on the brink of Hudson River, on his passage from West Point to Dobb's ferry in the State of New York; which branch struck the eye of said Hebron, after which he lost the sight thereof and became blind.

Where disabled: Hudson's river.

Residence: County of Philadelphia.

To what pension entitled: Full.

Remarks: Enlisted May 10, 1777; continued to the end of the war.

Evidence transmitted by the District Court incomplete; no evidence to prove disability from known wounds, nor where he has resided since he left the service as required by law.
