

**Pension Application for Joseph Hennegin or Hennegan or Hennagin**

W.10097 (Widow: Rhoda) Married March 20, 1785. Joseph died April 6, 1833. Letter in folder dated October 12, 1932, written in response to an inquiry.

You are furnished herein the Revolutionary War record of Joseph Hannegin, as found in papers on file in claim for pension, W.10097, Based upon his service in that war.

Joseph Hannigin was born January 6, 1759, place not stated, nor were the names of his parents given. His signature is shown in the claim "Hennegin" but the name appears, also, "Hennegan" and "Hennagin".

Joseph Hennagin enlisted in New York [blot] time in April, 1776, served as a private in Captain Henry O'Harra's company, Colonel Wynkoop's New York regiment, about January 1777, he reenlisted, and served in Captain O'Hara's company and Captain Richard Lloyd's company, and at Princeton joined Colonel Moses Hazen's "Congress Regiment", and served until discharged at Fishkill, January 1, 1781.

He was allowed pension on his application executed April 14, 1818, at which time he was a resident of Manlius, Onondaga County, New York.

The soldier, Joseph Hennegin, moved about March 1825 to Indiana. He died April 6, 1833 in Ripley County, Indiana.

Joseph Hennegin married March 20, 1785 in Kingsbury New York, Rhoda, whose maiden name was not designated; and she was born February 11, 1763, place not shown, nor were the names of her parents given.

The widow, Rhoda Hennegin, was allowed pension on her application executed February 12, 1839, at which time she was living in Sparta Township, Dearborn County, Indiana. She was living in Delaware Township, Ripley County, Indiana, in 1848.

Their son, Peter "Hennegan" as he signed in 1839, was then a resident of Dearborn County, Indiana.
