

Pension Application for Henry Herald

On this eleventh day of April eighteen hundred and eighteen before me the subscriber, one of the Judges of the Inferior Court of Common Pleas of said County, personally appears Henry Herald aged sixty one years resident in Sussex County in said District, who being first duly sworn according to law, doth, make the following declaration in order to obtain the provision made by the late act of Congress entitled, an act to provide for certain persons engaged in the land and naval service of the United States in the revolutionary War.

That he the said Henry Herald he thinks in the year 1775 enlisted in the State of New York in the company commanded by Capt. Hughes in Col'o James Livingston's Regiment that he was enlisted during the war [enlisted for duration of the war] and that he continued to serve in the said corps until the seventeenth day of August 1780 when he was discharged from service at Verblanks Point in the State of New York, he having enlisted two men in his place—

That he was in the Battle of Saint Johns in Canada, the storming of Quebeck with Genl Montgomery, the taking of Genl Burgoyne, & at Springfield in New Jersey & many others—and that he is in reduced circumstances, and stand in need of the assistance of his country for support, and that he has no other evidence now in his power of his said services, having lost his discharge.
