

Pension Application for John Hickey

John Hickey, a resident of the town of Hempstead in the County aforesaid, being duly sworn deposes and says, that he is ninety six years of age; that he is a native of Ireland and arrived in this country in the year one thousand eight hundred and sixty four; that he enlisted in the army of the United States, at the commencement of the American Revolution, and continued in the service until the close of the war.

That he enlisted at Goshen in the State of New York, under Colonel Livingston; that he served under Captain Denton, and under other officers whose names he cannot recollect; that he was present at and engaged in the battle on Long Island; in the engagement on York Island, at the battle of Monmouth; and at the battle of Brandywine; that he was also present at the storming of Quebec, under General Montgomery.

And this deponent further saith that a short time after leaving the service, he lost his discharge and has never since recovered possession of it. (Signed with his mark) John Hickey
