

**Pension Application for John Hill**

John Hill being duly sworn saith that he is a resident of the County of Oneida and State of New York. That he is sixty two years old and upwards—that by reason of his reduced circumstances in life he is in need of assistance from his country for support—that he never had any pension allowed him by the laws of the United States—that he served as a soldier in the war of the Revolution on the Continental Establishment one year and four months. He enlisted in 1776 in Hick's Company VanSchaick's Regiment, Schuyler's Brigade or Division and served therein about one year after which he served four months in Pearce's Company Grahams Regt, Clinton's Brigade. He was honorably discharged from both services. His discharge is lost.

I Benjamin Hicks of the Town of Springfield in the County of Otsego and State of New York being duly sworn depose and say. That in 1776 I was commissioned as a Captain in Colo Goose VanSchaick's Regiment. That the said regiment was raised for ten months – and that on or about the first day of April of that year I enlisted John Hill as a private soldier and that from that time he faithfully served in my company in said Regiment till the first of the following January at which time he was honourably discharged and that said Regiment was raised by and in the service of the United States (Signed) Benj'n Hicks
