County of Seneca SS.

On this fourth day of October in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and twenty personally appeared in open court, (being a court of Common Pleas, holden in and for the county of Seneca, in the district aforesaid, and a Court of Record, proceeding according to the course of common law, with a jurisdiction unlimited in point of amount, keeping a record of its proceedings and having a common seal,) Joshua Hinckley aged 65 a resident in said district, in the town of Fayette in the county aforesaid, who being first duly sworn according to law, doth on his oath declare that he served in the Revolutionary War as follows.

That he was a private soldier in the company commanded by Robert Wacker in Col. Lamb's Redgmt [Regiment] that he inlisted [enlisted] he thinks in April 1777 during war and that he was at the taking of St. Johns Montreal and at the taking of Corn Wallis and was discharged in June 1783 at West Point the date of his former application was April 14th 1818 that the No. of his certificate is S. 957?

And I do solemnly swear that I was a resident citizen of the United States, on the eighteenth day of march, one thousand eight hundred and eighteen, and that I have not, since that time, by gift, sale, or in any manner whatever, disposed of my property, or any part thereof, with intent thereby so to diminish it as to bring myself within the provisions of an act of congress, entitled "An act to provide for certain persons engaged in the land and naval service of the United States in the Revolutionary war," passed on the eighteenth day of March, one thousand eight hundred and eighteen, and that I have not, nor has any person in trust for me, any property, or securities, contracts, or debt, due to me; nor have I any income, other what is contained in the schedule hereto annexed and by me subscribed.

And I do further swear that I am by trade a farmer and not able to work much or half enough to support myself and family that my family that my family [sic]

consists of my wife Sarah aged 57 being weekly [weakly] and one Dauter [Daughter] named Hester aged 18 who supports herself.
