

Pension Application for Zachariah Holtzapple

Be it remembered that on the eleventh day of April in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and eighteen before me John J. Miller first Judge of the Court of Common Pleas of the said County of Columbia personally appeared Zachariah Holtzapple who after having been duly sworn did depose and say that he is now a resident of the Town of Claverack in the County of Columbia and State of New York.

That he enlisted in the service of the United States for one year on of the first day of February one thousand seven hundred and seventy six in Captain John Wendell's company belonging to Colonel Cornelius Wynkoop's Regiment and served ten months and twenty four days of the said year in the said Company of Capt John Wendell when he was discharged, that he the deponent again enlisted in the service of the United States about the first day of January one thousand seven hundred and seventy seven in Capt. Peter VanRensselaer's company and Colonel James Livingston's Regiment of the New York Line of Troops for the term of three years or during the war.

That he served in the said company and regiment for about three years until the year one thousand seven hundred and eighty and was then transferred to Captain Samuel F. Bell or Samuel T. Pell's Company belonging to Colonel Philip VanCortlandt's Regiment in which company and regiment he served until the seventh day of June in the year one thousand seven hundred and eighty three when he was discharged having served as a soldier in the service of the United States against the Common Enemy for about seven years and four months; that he the deponent is about seventy one years of age and that from his reduced circumstances in life, he needs the assistance of his country, for support and hereby applies to be placed on the Pension list of the United States according to the Act of Congress of March 19th 1818.
