

**Pension Application for John Homan or Homans**

Orange County SS.

On this thirty first day of May 1820 personally appeared in open court in the Court of Common Pleas, it being a Court of record for the said County of Orange, who being duly sworn according to law, doth on his oath declare, that he served in the Revolutionary War as follows:--

I enlisted Capt Building of Fort Montgomery—After serving our company in Colonel H.B. Livingston's Regiment New York line. I served near one year when I was discharged by Lt Colonel Regnier at New Windsor and I do solemnly swear that I was a resident citizen of the United States on the 18<sup>th</sup> day of March 1818; and that I have not since that time by gift, sale, or in any manner disposed of my property, so as to bring myself within the provisions of the act of Congress, called "an act to provide for certain persons engaged in the land and naval service of the United States in the Revolutionary War" passed the 18<sup>th</sup> day of March, 1818; and that I have not nor has any person in trust for me, any property or securities, contracts, or debts due to me; nor have I any income other than what is contained in the following accounting and by me subscribed viz: that he has no property of any kind—that his pension certificate is dated 18<sup>th</sup> day of November 1818 and his certificate is number 4479.
