

Pension Application for Gershom or Gersham Hubbell

S.2,642

State of Ohio

The County of Hamilton SS.

On this fifteenth day of August Anno Domini 1832, personally appeared in open court before the Court of Common Pleas, for the County of Hamilton, now sitting, Gershom Hubbell, a resident of Mill Creek Township, in the County and State aforesaid aged sixty six years, who being first duly sworn according to law, doth on his oath, make the following declaration in order to obtain the benefit of the Act of congress passed June 7, 1832.

That he entered into the service of the United States, under the following named officers, and served as herein stated.

He enlisted as a militia man, on the first day of April 1782, at Fishkill in Dutchess County in the State of New York, and was afterwards when mustered, transferred to Captain White's (1) Company, in Col. Wisenfelt's regiment of the New York Militia. After serving a few weeks under these officers, deponent was transferred to Capt. Moody's (2) Company of Artillery in Col. John Lamb's regiment in the New York State line and was stationed at West Point in the State of New York where he remained until he was discharged on the 20 day of December 1782; the name of the officer who gave the discharge was Lieutenant Col. Stevens, (3) who then commanded the regiment. This deponent hath not the discharge alluded to in his possession; he gave it up to his master, the deponent being then an apprentice, since which he hath not know of the same.

He hereby relinquishes every claim whatever to a pension or annuity except the present, and declares that his name is not on the pension roll of the agency of any state. (Signed) Gershom Hubbell

End Notes—Gershom Hubbell – S.2642

Gershom is not listed as part of Captain Andrew White's Company in Colonel Frederick Weisenfels' Regiment of New York State Levies in 1782, but he is listed as follows in: "Payroll of Levies under the Command of Col. Frederick Weisenfels who were drafted from his Regiment into the Continental Army for the Month of May 1782" as follows.

2. Andrew Moody was a Captain in Colonel John lamb's Second Continental Artillery Regiment. In checking the muster rolls for this company in 1783, none of the levies are shown as being assigned to this company. FROM: Revolutionary War Rolls 1775-1783, Series M-246, Roll 119, Folder 45, National Archives, Washington D.C.
However in Folder 50, Roll 120 are six muster rolls for these levies and Gershom is listed on all of them. The levies were never listed as being assigned to any particular company. They are listed in various capacities such as "Making shingles with Lieut. Reed". Lieutenant Reed was of the Second Artillery.
3. Lieutenant Colonel Elenezer Stevens of the Second Artillery.
