

Pension Application for Byaley Hyatt

W.19851 (Widow: Eunice) Married February 10, 1789, he died March 15, 1833.

Declaration. Required by "An Act Granting Half Pay and Pensions to Certain Widows."
Passed July 7th 1838.

On this 20th day of September 1838 personally appeared before the Marine Court of the City of New York, Eunice Hyatt, a resident of the City of New York in the County of New York aged seventy-five years, who, being first duly sworn according to law, doth on her oath make the following declaration, in order to obtain the benefit of the provision made by the Act of Congress, passed July 7th 1838, entitled "An Act granting Half Pay and Pension to certain Widows:" That she is w Widow of Byaley Hyatt who was a Teamster in the quartermaster's department of Major sometimes called Coll. Hughes in the Continental Army during the War of the Revolution as will more fully appear from affidavits of henry Depew and Wm. Gailor hereto annexed—

That he served first in Yorktown, then in Courtland town, at Continental Village Westchester County New York, and was discharged at Verplanks Point Westchester County New York.

She further Declares, that she was married to the said Byaley Hyatt on the Tenth day of February in the year seventeen hundred and eighty nine; that her husband, the aforesaid Byaley Hyatt died on the Fifteenth day of March 1833, that she was not married to him prior to his leaving the service, but the marriage took place previous to first of January, seventeen hundred and ninety-four, viz: at the time above stated.
