

Pension Application for Alexis or Elexis Jenville

At a Court of Common Pleas holden at the Court House in Plattsburgh in and for the County of Clinton & State of New York on the first Tuesday of October one thousand eight hundred and twenty seven Present. John Lynch, Cobb Nicholas & Daniel L. Taylor.

Judges of the said Court on this third day of October 1827 personally appeared in open court being a Court of Record in the County of Clinton Alexis Jenville aged seventy five years resident in said County who being first duly sworn according to law, doth, on his oath make the following declaration in order to obtain the provision made by the Acts of Congress of the 18th March 1818 & the first of May 1820; that he the said Alexis Jenville enlisted for the term of four and during the war on the [blank] Day of [blank] in the year 1777 in the State of New York in the company commanded by Captain Olivie in the regiment commanded by Colonel Moses Hansen in the line of the State of New York in the Continental Establishment; that he continued to serve in the said corps until June 21, 1783, when he was discharged from service in Newburgh in the State of New York that he hereby relinquishes every claim whatever to a pension except the present; that his name is not on the roll of any state except New York; and that the following are the reasons for not making earlier application for a pension viz that he could not from his services in consequence of the mislaying of his discharge.

And in pursuance of the Act of the first of May 1820 I do solemnly swear that I was a resident citizen of the United States on the 18th day of March 1818 & that I have not since that time by gift, sale, or in any manner disposed of my property or any part thereof with intent thereby so to diminish it as to bring myself within the provisions of an act of congress, entitled "An act to provide for certain persons engaged I n the land and naval service of the United States in the Revolutionary War" passed on the 18th day of March 1818 and that I have not nor has any person in trust for me any property in securities, contracts or debts due to me; nor have I any income other than what is contained in the schedule hereto annexed & by me subscribed. That since the 18th of March 1818 no changes has been made in my property.
