Dear Sir,

In the case of Jacob Coon, I send you the Comptrollers Certificate and also a copy of a Certificate, in the Case of George Jewell, whose case has been refered [referred] to you heretofore by letter and are heretofore by letter and we answer to which, I rec'd from you dated May 24, 1843—

I would beg leave to ask you for all the information you can give me, consistent with the rules of the Department, especially in the case of George Jewell. He has no one to assist him but myself and so poor that he cannot pay one farthing of the expense. He can prove years of patrole, duty in which he was engaged every other night alternately when he was not called away on other duty. The Comptrollers Certificate, probably give all the proof that can be found on the Books at Albany. Yours Respectfully, Robert Gallt.
