

### **Pension Application for Thomas Jones**

In Northern District of New York Ulster County SS

On this fifth day of July 1820 personally appeared in open court in the Court of Common Pleas it being a Court of record for the said County of Ulster Thomas Jones aged seventy four years resident in the said County of Ulster who being duly sworn according to law doth on his oath declare that he served in the Revolutionary War as follows.

Enlisted on the 4<sup>th</sup> of March 1776 in the State of New York for during the war in the Company of Captain Amos Hutchinson in the Regt commanded by Coll Lewis Dubois & served until the year 1782 when he was discharged at Newburgh in the State of New York No. of Pension certificate 5763 original Declaration made April 20, 1818.

And I do solemnly swear that I was a resident Citizen of the United States on the 18<sup>th</sup> day of March 1818.

And that I have not-nor has any person in trust for me any property or securities or Contracts due to me nor have I any income other than what is contained in the following inventory and by me subscribed.

Viz: No real estate. No personal estate. No family. Has nine children all grown up but two aged 11 & 12 years. These two he is obliged to provide for the rest keep themselves. Deponent is unable to support himself on account of rheumatism and pain in his side proceeding from the braking of three of his ribs at the Storming of Cornwallis works at York Town. (Signed with his mark) Thomas Jones
