

### **Pension Application for William Jones**

S.9362 (Wife Mercy) William died Jan 1, 1833. William was sergeant in the 3<sup>rd</sup> New York. William was a shoe maker. Mary died March 17, 1833. The file doesn't give a deposition by either William or Mary; it does contain depositions by the children of the couple and others who knew the couple.

It is hereby certified that at a Surrogates Court held this 9<sup>th</sup> day of September 1846 in & for the County aforesaid present the Hon. N. P. Wardwile Surrogatory said County it was proved by the adduction of testimony satisfactory to the said court; that William Jones late of the township of Scarborough in the Province of Canada West died in said township on the first day of January eighteen hundred and thirty three (Jany 1, 1933) and that he left a widow whose name was Mercy Jones and that she died in said township on the seventeenth day of March one thousand eighteen hundred & thirty three (March 17, 1833) and that James Jones, William Jones, Mary Ellis wife of Thomas Ellis & Elizabeth Brooks wife of Jacob Brooks, four in number all residents of Canada are the children, the lawful and only children of the said William Jones and March Jones and that they are all of lawful age and the only heirs.

In testimony whereof I have hereunto set my hand and office and the seal of my office at Watertown this 9<sup>th</sup> day of September 1846. Nathaniel P. Wardwell, Surrogate.

By Marrinus Willett Esqr Lieut. Colonel of the Third New York Regiment whereof Peter Gansevoort Esqr is Colonel. These are to certify that the Bearer hereof William Jones Serj in Capt. Leonard Bleeker's Comp, aged thirty one years, five feet five inches and a half high, fair complexion, Brown Hair, blue eyes, born in Sussex County New Jersey, by Trade a cordwainer. Has served in the above said Regiment Company for the space of three years the term for which he was insited and is discharged from the said regiment. He having received his pay arrear of Pay, Clothing of all sorts and all other just demands from the time of his Inlisting in the said Regt to this day of his discharge as appears by his receipt on the back of his Discharges Given under my hand this November 1779.
