

### **Disability for Joseph Sheldon**

Sheldon, Joseph

His name appears on a list of applicants for invalid pension returned by the District Court for the District of New York, submitted to the House of Representatives by the Secretary of War on April 25, 1794, and printed in the American State Papers, class 9, page 95.

Disability: Wounded in legs at the battle of Connecticut Farms, New Jersey. (1)

Where disabled: Connecticut Farms

Residence: New Cornwall

Remarks: Enlisted May 30, 1777 (2) for the war. The Judge of the District Court reports no evidence whatever.

#### End Notes—Disability—Joseph Sheldon

1. Battle of Connecticut Farms, New Jersey was fought on June 7, 1780.
2. Joseph enlisted as a private for during war in Captain John Sandford's [Santford, Sandvoord, etc.] Company on May 30, 1777 in Colonel William Malcolm's Additional Continental Regiment.
