

**Pension Application for John B. Joyal**

S.15485 [There is no deposition for this soldier in his file.]

Letter in folder dated October 5, 1936, written in response to an inquiry.

Reference is made to your request for information relative to Revolutionary War soldier, John B. Joyall.

The Revolutionary War records of this office show that John B. Joyal, resident of Franklin County, Vermont, was pensioned for two years service as private in Colonel Livingston's New York regiment. He received \$80 per annum, commencing March 4, 1831, and the certificate of pension was issued June 12, 1834, under the Act of June 7, 1832, Vermont agency.

There are no further data on file as the original papers on which the claim was allowed were sent to the Committee Room, Revolutionary Pensions, House of Representatives, on December 13, 1856, and were never returned.
