

Pension Application for Zabud June

Tompkins County SS.

Zabud June of the Town of Dryden County of Tompkins and State of New York aged sixty three years appeared before me the subscriber one of the Judges of the Court of Common Pleas in and for the County of Tompkins who being by me first duly sworn according to law doth on his oath make the following declaration in order to obtain he provisions made by the late act of Congress entitled an act to provide for certain persons engaged in the Land and Naval Service of the United States in the Revolutionary War”.

That the said Zabud June in the month of January one thousand seven hundred & seventy seven received a warrant as Ensign in Captain Watkins Company in Col. Malcolm Regiment, said Warrant was signed by John Hancock President of the Continental Congress and that the warrant was to the best of his belief burnt some years since in a house belonging to his brother in Land in which house his papers were at that time, and that he served as ensign in Captain Watkins Company & Col. Malcom [Malcolm] Regiment until the month February 1778 and was there discharged from said regiment as a supernumary officer at Valley Forge. The discharge was also burnt to the best of his belief during his service in Captain Watkins Company as aforesaid he was in no battles excepting a Skirmish at [Serallenty?], that from his reduced circumstances and being a cripple he stands in need of the assistance of his country for support—and that he is not appraised of any pension having been granted him under the laws of the United States and hereby freely relinquishes all and every pension heretofore allowed him by the laws of the United States. Letter in folder dated March 30, 1938, written in response to an inquiry.

Reference is made to your letter in which you request information in regard to Zabud June, a soldier of the Revolutionary War, who was living in Tompkins County, New York, when he applied for pension.

The data which follow were obtained from the papers on file in Revolutionary War pension claim, S.45431, based upon the military service in that war of Zabud June.

The date and place of birth and names of the parents of Zabud June are not shown.

Zabud June entered the service, place not shown, January 16, 1777, was appointed ensign and served as such officer in captain Watkins' Company, Colonel William Malcolm's Continental Regiment until February 11, 1778, when he left the service at Valley Forge. He stated that he served subsequently until the close of the war but gave no details.

Zabud June applied for pension April 14, 1818, but the papers in that application were returned to him. He renewed his application in September 1820, while residing in Dryden, Tompkins County, New York, aged sixty-three years. His claim was allowed.

He died April 28, 1825, place not shown.

There are no data as to this officer's family.
