

## **Pension Application for David Kronkhite**

On this 22<sup>nd</sup> day of August 1832 personally appeared before me, Munson Buel one of the Judges of the Court of Common Pleas in & b for the County of Greene David Kronkhite a resident of Windham in said county aged seventy four years, who being first duly sworn according to law, doth on his oath, make the following declaration in order to obtain the benefit of the Act of Congress passed June 7, 1832.

That he entered the service of the United States under the following named officers and served as herein stated.

That about the first day of August 1776 he enlisted for nine months in the New Levies, rendezvoused at Greenbush in the State of New York, was embarked in a Sloop and went down Hudson's River & was stationed at Fort Constitution was under the command of Capt. Bentley & was commanded by Col. Howe served out the nine months & was discharged.

That in the month of April 1777 he enlisted as a private under Capt. Friest of the New York State troops in the Regt. Commanded by Col. V's Rensselaer & was marched from Albany by way of Fort Edward to Skeensborough was in the retreat before Genl Burgoyne and was present at the Battles of Stillwater & Saratoga, and after the surrender of Genl Burgoyne was sent to Fort Edward there to Albany & during the next year was stationed a while at Schoharry then at Johnstown and at various others along the Mohawk River and at Cherry Valley and was present when Col. Butler of the corps of Tories was killed on the Mohawk recollects of the officers of the Regt besides those already mentioned. Major Fonda, Capt. Sharpe, Lieut. McManney & Lieut V'n Alstyn—recollects of the continental officers Genl Schuyler, Cols Brooks, Morgan & Scammel.

That at the expiration of said two years he was discharged by Col V'n Rannselaer & that the said discharge is now lost.

That at the time of entering the service at each of the times above mentioned he resided at the town of Greenbush in the state of New York. That he has no documentary evidence and knows of no person whose testimony he can procure who can testify to his service.

He hereby relinquishes every claim to a pension or annuity except the present and declares that his name is not on the pension roll of the agency of any state.
