

**Pension Application for Joseph Labe**

W.20387 (Mary Ursale, Widow) Married November 3, 1776. Joseph died Feb 24, 1835.

For the purpose of obtaining the benefits of an act entitled "An act for the relief of certain surviving Officers and Soldiers of the Army of the Revolution" approved on the 15<sup>th</sup> of May 1828. I Joseph Labo of Champlain in the County of Clinton in the State OF New York do hereby declare that I enlisted in the Continental Line of the Army of the Revolution for & during the war, and continued in its service until its termination; at which period I was a private in Captain Labonte's - company in Col. Livingston's Regiment of the New York Line.

And I also declare that I afterwards received certificates for the reward of eighty dollars, to which I was entitled under a resolve of Congress passed the [16<sup>th</sup>] of May 1778.

And I do further declare, that I was not on the fifteenth day of May 1828, on the Pension List of the United States.
