

Pension Application for James Laframbois or Laframboise

On this sixteenth day of December in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred & eighteen before me the subscriber, one of the Judges of the Court of Common Pleas in and for the said County personally appears James Laframbois aged eighty seven years, resident in the Town of Chazy and County of Clinton and State of New York; who being by me first duly sworn according to law, doth on his oath make the following declaration in order to obtain the provisions made by the late act of Congress entitled "An act to provide for certain persons engaged in the land & naval service of the United States in the revolutionary war."

That he the said James Lafambois enlisted in the month of November in the year 1777 at Fort Johnstown in the State of New York in the company commanded by one Allen—the Christian name this deponent does not recollect—Colonel James Livingston's regiment of the New York line of troops for the term of three years.

That he continued to serve in the said corps or in the service of the United States to the end of the said three years, when he was discharged from service at Kings Ferry in said State of New York.

That after said Allen raised to command said company he was under the command of one Teneyke who previous to that term was Paymaster—that he was in the battle of Rhode Island under General Sullivan—and that he is in reduced circumstances and stands in need of the assistance of his country for support—and that he has no other evidence now in his power of his said service—that he [?] and was mustered a corporal and served as such the whole time.
