

Pension Application for Abraham Lambert

In a Court of Common Pleas held at the Court house at Bedford in and for the County of Westchester before the Judges of the said Court at the Term of September in the year of Our Lord one Thousand eight hundred and twenty.

Present the Honorable William Jay first Judge, Jonathan Ferris, Stephen B. Hoffman Judges.

Be it Remembered that one the twenty fifth day of September in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and twenty personally appeared in the Court of Common Pleas held in and for the County of West Chester, in Open Court, the same being a Court of Record for the said County of Westchester Abraham Lambert aged fifty eight years resident in the County of Westchester, who being first sworn according to Law doth on his oath declare that he served in the Revolutionary war as follows.

He first inlisted [enlisted] as a private soldier in Captain Teabouts Company in Col. Gansevoorts Regiment in General James Clinton's Brigade in the year one thousand seven hundred and seventy seven, and that he Continued to serve as such soldier, until the Close of the Revolutionary War that he was Regularly discharged at Yorktown (or Little York) in the State of Pennsylvania in the year one thousand seven hundred and eighty three, that he was at the taking of the Hessians at Trenton, at the Battle of Fort Stanwix under Col. Gansevort and at the taking of Cornwallace.—

And that his original declaration is dated the thirteenth day of November one thousand eight hundred and Eighteen and that his pension Certificate is No. 4369.

And I do solemnly swear That I was a resident Citizen of the United States on this 18th day of March 1818 and that I have not since that time by Gift, sale or in any Manner disposed of my property or of any part thereof with intent thereby so to diminish it as to bring myself within the provisions of an act of Congress entitled "An act to provide for Certain persons engaged in the Land and Naval Service of the United States in the Revolutionary War passed the 18th day of March one thousand eight hundred and eighteen and that I have not, nor has any person in trust for me any property or Securities, Contracts or debts due to me, nor have I any income other than what is contained in the schedule hereunto annexed and subscribed by me—to wit.

That he has not any property of any description whatsoever excepting his wearing apparel, which consists of one Coat one Westcoat two pair of trouses [trousers], two shirts two handkerchiefs, two pair of stockings one pair of shoes and one hat and one great coat. That he has no family to support or maintain. (Signed) Abraham Lambert
