

Pension Application for Peter Lampman, Corporal

[This is interesting, part of the page is burned away, in the archive fire in Albany March 29, 1911 when so many valuable papers and records were lost.]

. . . detained a certificate. . . mined and Countersigned setting. . . had served as a Corporal in Captain C[hristopher] Fox Company in the Regiment of Militia. . . [com]manded by Col. Jacob Klock that he . . . was [wound]ed in his Riht [sic] hip at Orisko on the 6th day of August 1777, and that he now lives in the District of Palatine and in the County of Montgomery. (Signed with his mark) Peter Landman

County of Montgomery, State of New York May 8th? 1786 Sworn before me Christian Nelles Justice.

Peter Landman came before me one of the Justices of the County of Montgomery in the State New York and made oath that he was examined by Abraham Ten Broek and Peter Gansevoort Esqr appointed by the said State for that purpose obtained a certificate and had his certificate examined and certified setting forth that he had served as a Corporal in Captain Faxes (1) Company in the Regiment of Militia Comanded by Col. Jacob Klock that he was wounded in his right hip at Orisko on the 6th of August 1777 and that he now lives in the Town of Palatine and in the County of Montgomery. (Signed with his mark) Peter Landman

County of Montgomery State of New York, May 16th 1786 sworn before me Christian Nelles Justice.

Albany Decemb'r 28, 1786

We the Subscribers certify that it appears by the original certificates and vouchers given to the within named Peter Lampman and Lodged with us. That he was wounded on the 6th day of Aug't 1777. As witness our hands. Abrm. Ten Broeck, Peter Gansevoort, Jun'r

We the Subscribers Abraham Ten Broeck and Peter Gansevoort Jun'r do certify upon an Examination, in pursuance of the law, entitled, "An Act making Provision for Officers, Soldiers, and Seaman, who have been disabled in the Service of the United States." Passed the 22d of April, 1786, We do find that Peter Lampman residing in the State of New York Aged Thirty four years, late a Corporal in Cap'n Fox's (2) Comp'y in the Regiment of Militia commanded by Jacob Klock, and Claiming Relief under the Act of Congress, recited in the said Law, as an Invalid in Fact; and that he became disabled in the Service of the United States, in Consequence of a wound through his Hip in the year - 1777.

And Do further Certify, that upon the Principles of the said Act of congress, the said Peter Lampman is entitled to the Pay of five Dollars per Month.

Given under our Hands, in the City of Albany, on the fourteenth day September in the Year of our Lord One Thousand Seven Hundred and Eighty-Six. Abm. Ten Broeck, Peter Gansevoort Jun'r.

End Notes—Disability—Peter Lampman

1. Christopher W. Fox was Captain of the Third Company in Colonel Jacob Klock's Second Regiment of Tryon County Militia.
2. Peter also appears to have served at various times in Captain John Zeely's and Peter Waggoner Jr's companies in Colonel Clock's Regiment. On a list of men who were paid in Klock's Regiment dated November 4, 1784, Peter presented two certificates to be paid as follows: Certificate was 1685 for £ 0. . 0. . 8 ³/₄, Peter Lampman (his mark), witness
