

Pension Application for George Lane

R.6121 (Widow: Hannah) Married April 1828. George died April 15, 1829.

On this 25 day of December 1855, personally appeared before the under signed a special Judge of Oneida County Courts, Hannah Lane, aged 83 years a resident of Rome in said County, who being first, duly sworn according to law, doth on his oath make the following declaration in order to obtain the benefit of the provision of the act of Congress passed Feb 3d, 18[??] and the preceding acts applicable to her case, granting pensions to widows of persons who served during the Revolutionary War, that she is the widow of George Lane, who was an express rider and bearer of dispatches in said war to [?] West Point & other posts & served under the orders of Gen. Washington & other officers as she is informed & believes for the term of six months—that neither sd George or herself has been pensioned, nor did he nor has she previously applied for that purpose.

She was married to said George Lane by one Jene Fish Esqr Just of Peace at the town of Floyd in the month of April 1828 & has no record of her said marriage, said George Lane died on or about the 15th day of Wapril 1829 at Floyd and she has from that time to present remained his widow. Her previous name was Hannah Butler.

She makes this declaration for the purpose of being placed on the Revolutionary pension list of the United States. (Signed with her mark) Hannah Lane
