

### **Pension Application for Nathan Lane**

R.6127 (Widow: Martha)

Nathan Lane son of Nathan Lane was born October Second in the year 1749.

Martha Mill was born the 3<sup>rd</sup> day of May 1771 and were personally connected together the 13<sup>th</sup> day of October in the year of our Lord 1783 and have [???

Mary born September 10<sup>th</sup> 1789.

Nancy born December 3, 1791, died September 3, 1792.

Nathan died December 16, 1830.

On this twelfth day of June in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and thirty nine personally appeared before the undersigned Albert Lockwood a Supreme Court Commissioner of the Supreme Court of Judicature of the People of the State of New York authorized to perform the duties &c of a Justice of the said Supreme Court at Chambers, Martha Lane a resident of the town of Yorktown in the County of Westchester aforesaid aged sixty eight years who being first duly sworn according to law doth on her oath make the following declaration in order to obtain the benefit of the provision made by the act of Congress passed July 7<sup>th</sup> 1838, Entitled "An act granting half pay and pensions to certain widows".

That she is the widow of Nathan Lane who was an ensign and Lieutenant in the war of the Revolution.

That he served, as she has often heard him say that in the revolutionary army but heard him say that in the revolutionary army but in what company or regiment she does not know nor does she now recollect to have heard him say, but she has under stood that he served in Colonel Luddington's Regiment. That she does not know how long he continued in the said service, but for the proof of his service and the nature thereof she refers the War Department, to the affidavits hereunto annexed and the records in the office of the war department at Washington.

She further declares that she was married to the said Nathan Lane on the thirteenth day of October in the year of our Lord our thousand seven hundred and eighty eight in the town of South Kortright Delaware County NY by Alexander Harper Esqr then a Justice of the peace of said town, that the record thereof hereto annexed is taken from the family bible of her said husband.

That her husband the aforesaid Nathan Lane died on the sixteenth day of December in the year one thousand eight hundred and thirty at Philiptown, that she was not married to him prior to his leaving the service, but the marriage took place previous to the first of January seventeen hundred and ninety four viz at the time above stated. (Signed with her mark) Martha Lane
