

Pension Application for Isaac Lent

AAC Lent of the town of Orange in the said county labourer, being duly sworn deposeth and saith that he is aged sixty seven years, that he is a resident of the town of Orange in the said County of Saratoga—the he served three years in the line of the army of United States, as an orderly Sergeant during the revolutionary war.

That he enlisted in the latter part of the year 1776 under Captain Thomas Lee as orderly Sergeant, until his resignation soon after the taking of Fort Montgomery by the British troops. At which time the command of the company disbanded upon Captain Henry Dubois, under whom he served in general Sullivan's expedition against the Indians in the western part of the State of New York and until the time of his discharge—

And this deponent farther saith that he was discharged on the expiration of his term of enlistment, at Morristown in New Jersey in December 1779 by James Stewart, at the time Captain Commandant—that he this deponents discharge has been worn and lost or mislaid and cannot now say what has become of it.

And this deponent farther saith that previous to his enlistment as above stated he had served as a drafted militia man eight months, and that he is now in such reduced circumstances, as to be in great need of assistance from his country for support and farther this deponent saith not.
