

### **Pension Application for Henry Livingston**

W.16328 (Widow: Jane M.) Henry married Jane M. Patterson September 1, 1793 by Rev. John Minor, Pastor of South East Church. Henry died February 29, 1828.

No deposition in file for Henry Livingston.

Letter in folder dated April 16, 1931, written in response to an inquiry.

You are advised that it appears from the papers in the Revolutionary War pension claim, W.16328, that Henry Livingston was commissioned August 2, 1775, Major of the of the Third New York Regiment, War of the Revolution. There are no further particulars In regard to his service.

He died February 29, 1828, in Poughkeepsie, New York. His age is not stated. He is referred to as Henry Livingston, Junior.

The soldier married September 1, 1793, Miss Jane McLean Paterson, second daughter of Matthew Paterson, Esquire, of Patterson, Dutchess County, New York. Their marriage was recorded on the records of the Presbyterian Church of South East, Putnam; County, New York. It was sated that at the time of this marriage, he had been a widower for ten years. The name of his former wife is not given and there is no reference to children by that marriage.

His widow, Jane, died August 26, 1838. Her age is not given.

She was survived by the following children: Sidney M. Livingston: Jane P., wife of William B. Thomas; in 1857, she was aged fifty years and a resident of Poughkeepsie, New York: Edwin G. Livingston, in 1840 residing in New York City: Charles P. Livingston, who in 1840 executed an affidavit In granger County, Ohio: Helen P. Livingston, who in 1840 executed an affidavit in Schenectady County, New York.

The pension that was due their mother, Jane M. Livingston, was allowed the above named children. The pension certificate was issued April 10, 1840.

The revolutionary War records of this bureau fail to afford any information in regard to Robert or Gilbert Livingston, as described by you, or to Robert Gilbert Livingston or Henry Gilbert Livingston, and the War of 1812 records do not show that a claim for pension was ever made on account of the services of Henry Gilbert Livingston or Henry or Gilbert Livingston.
