

Pension Application for Jesse Lockwood

On this 8th day of March one thousand eight hundred and fifty three personally appeared before me, a Notary public within and for the state aforesaid, Sarah Miller, who being duly sworn according to law, deposes, and says, that she is the daughter and only surviving heir of Jesse Lockwood, who served as orderly Sergeant in the Continental line in the Revolutionary War in Captain Delevans Company and in General Waynes Division and that he never received either bounty land or pension.

Jesse Lockwood her father was born July the second 1745 and died January 13th 1823, aged seventy seven years six months and eleven days.

Mary Lockwood her mother, whose name before marriage was Mary Hawes and joined in holy matrimony by the celebrated Rev'd George Whitefield and died on the twenty third day of May 1818, aged sixty eight years, seven months and two days.

Deponent further states that her brother Ishabod died in Genoa in the State of New York on the eighteenth day of February one thousand eight hundred and fifty two and that there is now no other child of the aforesaid Jesse Lockwood now surviving—that she was born in Westchester County N.Y. in the year 1786.
