On this thirtieth day of May 1820 personally appeared in open court in the Court of Common [Pleas] it being a court of record for the said County of Orange Major Samuel Logan aged Seventy six years, resident in the said County of Orange, who being duly sworn according to law, doth, on his oath declare, that he served in the Revolutionary war as follows—he served as a Major in Colonel Paulding’s regiment in the year 1776 then I was appointed a Major of the 5th New York regiment commanded by Colonel Lewis DuBois he continued in the same Regiment until it was reduced in the year 1780—he then entered into a Regiment commanded by Colonel Weisenvelt’s to protect the frontiers of the State of N.Y.

And I do solemnly swear that I was a resident citizen of the United States on the 18th day of March 1818; and that I have not since that time by gift, Sale, or in any manner disposed of my property, or any part thereof, with intent thereby so to diminish it as to bring myself within the provisions of ;the act of Congress entitled—“An act to provide for certain persons engaged in the land and navel Service of the United States, on the Revolution” [sic] passed the 18th day of March 1818; and that I have nor has any persons in trust for me, any property or securities, contracts, or debts due to me”, nor have I any income other than what is contained in the following Inventory and my me subscribed viz.

He is quite destitute of any kind of property, and is unable to do any kind of business whereby to support himself –his pension certificate is dated 20th day of May 1818 number 639. Saml Logan.
