

Pension Application for Adam Lohnes

W.245585 (Widow: Elizabeth) Adam Lohnes married Elizabeth Bonds on September 19, 1793. Adam died April 4, 1839.

Personally appeared before me the undersigned first Judge of Rensselaer County Adam Lohnes who being duly sworn deposeth and says that by reason of old age & infirmities and the consequent loss of memory he cannot recollect all the officers under whom he served during his services of the revolution, but that in addition to those mentioned in his previous and foregoing affidavit he served j der a Captain Henry Tinker in 1777 or 1778 in whose company this deponent was ensign that he served under Capt. Tinker after the services as heretofore stated as performed under Capt. Christopher Tillman that he served under Captain Tinker about four months as near as this deponent can recollect that he this deponent entered the service under Capt. Tinker as a volunteer in Rensselaer County, that they marched to Fort Edward and at the expiration of ;said term of service he was discharged but received no written discharge.

That also after the services as before stated by this deponent on the Mohawk River under Col. Peter Schuyler & Col. Butler & after the battle when Genl Herkimer was killed, and during the latter part of the war the exact year this deponent cannot recollect he served as a volunteer & Ensign and marched form Brunswick Rensselaer Co., N.Y. up the Mohawk under the command of one Neal McNeil as Captain, that Col. Henry K. VanRensselaer was colonel and that this was after the said Henry K. Vanrensselaer was wounded that he this deponent served under the said McNeil one year and a half as near as this deponent can recollect-

That he this deponent always volunteered at the different times he entered the service. That he this deponent received a commission of Ensign in the year 1776 or 1777 signed by George Clinton then Governor of the State of New York that the same has been lost and this deponent can not tell what has become of the same

That this deponent is now so infirm that he is not able to attend a court and that since this deponents first affidavit was made Sebastian Lohnes named in said affidavit has died, that Christopher File and Abraham Roberts who were mentioned in the deponents former affidavit are personally knowing to the services of this deponent as a soldier & Ensign in the revolution and further this deponent saith not.
