

Pension Application for Jonathan Lord

County of Warren;

On this Twelfth day of September 1820 personally appeared in open Court in the Court of Common Pleas of the said County the same being a Court of Record for the said County proceeding according to the course of the Common law, with a Jurisdiction unlimited in point of amount, keeping a record of the proceedings and having the power of fine and imprisonment Jonathan Lord late a private in the Army of the Revolution aged sixty ;nine years resident in the said County in the State aforesaid, who being first duly sworn according to law, doth;, on his oath, declare that he served in the Revolutionary War as follows.

That he enlisted in the month of December in the year 1776 at Albany under Captain Timothy Hughes in a Regiment commanded by Colonel James Livingston of the Line of the State of New York and served untill the 4th Jan'y 1780 when he received an Honorable discharge at a place near Morristown (New Jersey) called Baskinridge.

That his original Declaration was made on or about the eighth [eighth] day of April 1818 and that his pension certificate is numbered 13,809—

And I do solemnly swear that I was a resident citizen of the United States on the 18th day of ;March 1818; and that I have not since that time by gift, sale, or in any manner disposed of my property or any part thereof, with intent, thereby so to diminish it, as to bring myself within the provisions of an Act of Congress entitled “an act to provide for certain persons engaged in the Land and Naval Service of the United States in the Revolutionary War” passed on the 18th day of March 1818 and that I have not nor has any person in Trust for me, any poperty or Securities, contracts or debts due me, any property or securities, contracts or debts due to me; nor have I any income other than what is contained in the Schedule hereto annexed and by me subscribed—

And he further saith that he was in the Battle of Fort Stanwix at the Taking of Burgoyne was in General Sullivan's Expedition on Rhode Island—and in a number of Skirmishes – (Signed) Jonathan Lord

Sworn to and declared on the 12th day of September 1820 before me in open Court. (Signed) Seth C. Baldwin Ck. Clerk of the Court of Common Pleas of the County of Warren.
