To the Commissioner of Pensions

The undersigned Benjamin Loring of the city & county of New York respectfully represents that on the 14<sup>th</sup> day of February in the year 1780, the under signed enlisted into the service of the United [States] in a company of Artillery of the State of New York under Captain Mott in Col. Lambs regiment as a musician for the term of during the war and continued to serve in said regiment until the close of said war as a musician & was discharged at West Point from Capt. Fenno's Company. That the undersigned was at the siege & capture of Yorktown under Col Stevens. That the undersigned is now a pensioner of the United States under the law of Congress passed March 18, 1818. And he hereby relinquishes his claim to a pension under the last aforesaid law. And request to be allowed a pension at a musician of Artillery under the law of 7<sup>th</sup> June 1832. Dated New York May 20<sup>th</sup> 1841. (Signed) Benj'n Loring
