

Pension Application for John Heinrich Loudaback or Lowdeback

New York Marine Court.

In the Marine Court of the City of New York held at the City Hall of the City of New York, before the Justices of the same Court on the third day of April in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and twenty two.

Present the Honorable Robert Swanton and Adrian Hegeman Justice of the said Court.

City of New York SS.

Be it remembered, That on the third day of April in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and twenty two personally appeared in the Marine Court of the City of New York in open Court the said Court being a Court of Record for the City of New York according to the Laws of the State of New York. John H. Loudeback aged about sixty five years resident in the City of New York who being first duly sworn according to law, doth on his oath declare that he served in the Revolutionary war as follows; that he this deponent enlisted, for the term of three years in the month of June one thousand seven hundred and eighty one at Stoney Point in the State of New York in the company commanded by Captain Andrew Moody in the Regiment commanded by Colonel Lamb in the line of the State of New York on the New York Continental establishment that he continued to serve in the said corps until the year one thousand seven hundred and eighty four when he was honorably discharged from the said service at West Point in the State of New York declarant saith that he was in no general engagement during the war but he was in several skirmishes and that he has no other evidences now in his power of his said services except the affidavits of John Ross and William Leaycraft heretunto annexed.
