

Pension Application for Abraham D. Lowe

Declaration in order to obtain the benefit of the act of Congress passed the 7th June 1832.

State of New York

Ulster County SS.

On the eleventh day of September in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and thirty two, personally appeared in open court before the Judges of the Court of Common Pleas in and for Ulster County, being a court of Record for said county, proceeding according to the course of common law, with a Jurisdiction unlimited in point of amount, and keeping a record of their proceedings, having a clerk and seal of their own, Abraham D. Lowe, a resident of the town of Saugerties in the County of Ulster aged Sixty nine years who being first duly sworn according to Law, doth on his oath make the following declaration, in order to obtain the benefit of the act of congress passed the 7th June 1832.

That he entered the service of the United States under the following named officers and served as herein stated: To wit.

That In the fall of the year 1779 he was drafted as a private soldier in the militia service of the State of New York in the Revolutionary War in the company commanded by Capt. Philip Swart for Three months and was stationed as a Frontier gaurd [sic, guard] at a Fort in Shandaken and continued there until said term of three months and was then there discharged.

And this applicant further declares that on or about the first of April in the year 1782 he volunteered as a private soldier in the said service of the State of New York in Capt Livingston's Company in Col. Wysenbelt's Regiment and was stationed as a frontier gaurd for Nine Months at Wawarsing, Marbletown, Woodstock and Shandaken, along the frontiers, and was about the first of January following (1783) discahrghed in Marbletown afores'd and he further declares that in the summer 1781 he again entered the same service as aforesaid in Capt. Moses Yeoman's Company of rangers for one month or more (in the six months) as one of a class and was stationed at Houghtaling in Kingston as a frontier gaurd—and was discharged after the one month.

And this applicant further declares that he was born in the town of Saugerties Ulster County in the year 1763—and that he lived there when called into service. And that he has lived there since the Revolutionary war—and lives there now. That he has no record of his age. That he was a Substitute & Volunteer, and that he has had no written discharge.

He hereby relinquishes every claim whatever to a pension or annuity except the present and declares that his name is not on the pension Roll of any agency in any state. (Signed with his mark) Abraham D. Lowe
