

Pension Application for George Marks

State of New York SS.

To the Hon. Richard Riker, Recorder of the City of New York, an done of the Judges of the Court of Common Pleas, called the Mayor's Court of the City of New York, which is a Court of Record of the State of New York.

The Declaration under Oath of George Marks formerly a Soldier engaged in the Service of the United States during the Revolutionary War, now a Citizen of the United States and resident of Rockland County of New York.

That the said George Marks Inlisted a Soldier sometime in the Month of Feby 1777 for Three years in Captain Hutchings Company Col Duboy Regiment of the fifth of the State of New York under the Continental Establishment and actually served untill the end of my Inlistment against the common Enemy and was then honorably discahrg'd from the Army of the United States but my discharges I have lost which was the forepart of the year 1780. (Signed) George Marks

And the declaration further sheweth, that the said George Monks is not a citizen of the United States, resides in the city of New York, and is, by reason of his reduced circumstances in life, in need of assistance from his country for support.

Therefore the said George Marks conceives himself entitled to the benefit of the Act of Congress of the United States, entitled, "An act to provide for certain persons engaged In the Land and Naval Service of the United States in the Revolutionary War," approved 18th March, 1818, and requests your Honor will examine into the truth of the matter aforesaid, certify and transmit the testimony in the case, and the proceedings had thereon, to the Honorable the Secretary of the Department of War, to the end that such relief may be had in the premises, as is by law in such case made and provided. And in support of the facts above set forth, the said George Marks—refers it Hanes Seats as to my services who was a non commission officer in the same Regiment with me the three years. (Signed) George Marks

City and County of New York, SS. George Monks of the County of Rockland State and County of New York, being duly sworn, saith, that the matters by him set forth in the foregoing Declaration, are in all respects just and true. (Signed) George Marks.
