

Pension Application for Daniel Marshall

S.13861 Died Nov 21, 1834.

Declaration in order to be placed on the Pension List under the act entitled "An act Supplementary to the "Act for the relief of certain surviving officers and soldiers of the revolution", approved June 7, 1832.

For the purpose of obtaining the benefits of the act entitled "an act supplementary to the "Act for the relief of certain surviving officers and soldier of the revolution", approved 7th June 1832.

I Daniel Marshall of Whitestown Oneida County & State of New York aged seventy years do hereby declare that I served as a private soldier in the army of the revolution during the years 1779, 1780, & 1781 in the whole for about the term of eighteen months at the times & in the manner following viz.

In the spring of 1779 I enlisted at Claverack in the County of Columbia & State of New York for the term of six months in the militia called the New levies in the company commanded by Captain Hawley in the Regiment commanded by Colonel John McKinster, that I was stationed a part of the time at West Point & a part of the time at Fishkill at which last place I was honorably discharged & was in the service at that time a few days less than six months.

In the month of May 1780 I again enlisted the five months at Claverack aforesaid, in Captain Pitcher's Company & was afterwards transferred to Captain Putnam's Company of rangers under Lieutenant Solomon Woodworth, that we were stationed at Johnstown in the state of New York & staid there about a month & was then transferred to Stone Arabia in said state & remained there until my term of enlistment had expired when I was honorably discharged.

On or about the first of May 1781 I again enlisted in Colonel Peter VanNess Regiment of Infantry in Captain Hogeboom's Company, that afterwards Captain James Delong had command of the company & Colonel Gabriel Esselstine took command of the regiment, that I was engaged under this enlistment of six months & remained for the term of six months & remained in the service that time, part of the [time] I was stationed at Schenectady & a part of the time at Fort Hunter on the Mohawk River & was honorably discharged.

That in the same year I was in the service as a volunteer about one month on the Mohawk river in Colonel Van Ness Regiment.

That I am not entitled to any benefit under the act for the relief of certain surviving officers & soldiers of the revolution passed the 15 day of May 1828 & that I do not now nor ever have received any annuity or pension under any law of the United States providing to revolutionary soldiers.
