Bounty Land Claim

Form of Declaration for Surviving Officer or Soldier.

State of New York

County of Seneca SS.

On this twenty seventh day of March A.D. one thousand eight hundred and fifty-five, personally appeared before me, Miner T. Coburn, a Justice of the Peace, duly authorized to administer oaths within and for the County and State aforesaid, Enos Marshall senior aged 100 years, a resident of Covert Seneca County in the State of New York, who being duly sworn according to law, declares that he is the identical Enos Marshall senior, who was a soldier in the Company commanded by Captain Wilhelmus Philips, thinks he resided in Kinderhook or Claverack in the County of Columbia Regiment not remembered commanded by Colonel Whiting of New Canan in the war of the Revolution that he march[ed] to Albany and drew his arms and went to Fort Edward about the Month of July in the year of one thousand seven hundred and seventy-seven A.S. for the term of six weeks and continued in actual service in said war for the term of six weeks and was honorably discharged at Stillwater on his being taken sick on or about the time General Gates succeeded [Honorable Scuyler] in command as will appear by the muster rolls of said Company. Commanded by Wilhelmus Philip Captain of the then New Concord (now probably Chelham Columbia County New York) Company.

He makes this declaration for the purpose of obtaining the bounty land to which he may be entitled under the "act granting additional bounty land to certain officers and soldiers who have been engaged in the military service of the United States," approved March 3, 1855. E. Marshall Senior

Sworn to and subscribed before me the day and year above written; and I hereby certify that I believe the said Enos Marshall Senior who signed and executed the above declaration, and is now present, to be the identical man who served as aforesaid, and that he is of the age above stated, and that I have no interest in said claim.
