

Pension Application for Baptist or Baptiste Martin

New York agency and residence.

For the purpose of obtaining the benefits of an act entitled "An act for the relief of certain surviving officers & soldiers of the Army of the Revolution approved on the 15th of May 1828, I Baptiste Martin of Champlain, [Range's?] Point N.Y. in the County of Clinton in the State of New York do hereby declare that I enlisted in the Continental line of the Army of the Revolution for and during the war & continued in its service until its termination, at which periods I was a soldier in Captain Goslin's Company in Genl. Hazen's Regiment of the New York Line. And I also declare that I afterwards received certificates for the reward of eighty dollars; to which I was entitled under a resolve of Congress passed the 15th of May 1778.

And I do further declare that I was not on the 15th of May 1828 on the Pension list of the United States.

Witness my hand, this twenty fourth day of march in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and twenty nine. (Signed with his mark) Baptiste Martin

Before Mr. Calvin K. Averill a Justice of the Peace in the County of Clinton in the State of New York personally appeared this day Herman Soselton and Nicholas Constantinan of the said County who did severally make oath that Baptiste Martin by whom the foregoing declaration was subscribed is generally reputed and believed to have been a soldier in the army of the Revolution in manner as therein stated. Witness my hand this twenty fourth day of March A.D. 1829. C. K. Averill J. Peace.
