On this 7th day of May 1846 personally appeared before the Justices Court of the City of Hudson in said County the same being a court of record, Alexander McIntosh—who being first duly sworn according to law doth on his oath make the following declaration in order to obtain the benefit of the act of congress of 7th June 1832, for the Revolutionary services of Alexander McIntosh deceased.

That he is the son of Alexander McIntosh who served in the War of the Revolution as follows—in the year 1776 in the William Stewarts Company Morris Grahams regiment 5 or 6 months, as he is informed & believes.

Declarant further says that the said Alexander McIntosh served in 1777 or 1778 under Captain Elislu Ingalls as teamster 4 or 5 months.

Declarant further says he has no means of stating how long said Alexander McIntosh served under Andrew Bostwick of Pine Plains and served as teamster as I have heard my father say about 18 months.

Declarant further says that the said Alexander McIntosh served one month in 1777 in Captain Bayley's Company exclusive of the 3 weeks he lay sick at Albany.

The above statement & claim is made from the information he has received from a copy of said Alexander McIntosh's Statement shown him & from an affidavit of Jacob Cous Shown him which affidavit is herewith sent.

My father said Alexander McIntosh died the twenty sixth day of February one thousand eight hundred & thirty five aged seventy seven years old, according to my recollection & according to the inscription on his tombstone.

My said Father left at his death myself, George McIntosh, William McIntosh & Hannah McIntosh him surviving his only children who are all of the age of twenty one years & upwards. (Signed with his mark) Alexander McIntosh.
