

Pension Application for Andrew McNutt

In the matter of Andrew McNutt a Soldier in the Revolutionary War on the Continental establishment against the Common Enemy.

State of New York

Montgomery County SS.

Be it remembered that on this twentieth day of April in the year of our Lord, one thousand eight hundred & Eighteen before me the Subscriber, one of the Judges of the Court of Common Pleas in and for the County of Montgomery and State of New York aforesaid; personally appeared Andrew McNutt aged fifty nine years, a resident of the town of Northampton in the County of Montgomery aforesaid, who, being by me first duly sworn, according to law, on oath made the following declaration in order to obtain the provision of the late act of Congress entitled "an act, to provide for certain persons, engaged in the land & naval service of the United States in the Revolutionary War".

That the said Andrew McNutt enlisted in the State of New York in a company commanded by Captain Joseph McCracken in a Regiment commanded by Colonel Goose VanSchaick in the New York line of Troops sometime in the month of May 1775, that he continued in the service of the United States untill the month of January 1777 when he was discharged at Albany in the State aforesaid—

That in the same month of January one thousand Seven hundred and Seventy Seven in the State aforesaid he again enlisted in a company commanded by the said Joseph McCracken in a Regiment Commanded by the said Colonel Goose VanSchaick for the term of three years that he continued in the Service of the United States on the Continental Establishment in the line of his duty against the common enemy in the Revolutionary war for the term last aforesaid of three years, and was discharged in the State of New Jersey in the year one thousand seven hundred & Eighty one, which said discharge he has lost or is destroyed.

That he was in the Storming of Quebec by General Montgomery & was in the battles of Bennington Stillwater and Monmouth.—

That from his reduced circumstances he stands in need of assistance from his county for support—That he has no other evidence now in his power of his said services, and has never received a pension from Government. (Signed) Andrew McNitt
