

Pension Application for Henry Miller

At a Surrogates' Court held in and for the County of Broome in the State of New York the same being a Court of Record held at the office of the Surrogate in the Village of Binghamton in said County personally appeared John B. Miller a resident of said County of Broome in said State aged sixty years who being first duly sworn in open court and on his oath states that he is a son of Henry Miller deceased, a late resident of Montgomery County in said State of New York and of Margaret Miller now deceased.

He this deponent further states that his father the said Henry Miller was a soldier and served in and during the war of the Revolution as follows—in the years 1776 and 1777 his father served as a Lieutenant about one year in the Militia or New York Line and that in the year 1778 his father the said Henry Miller was a Captain and had a company under his command and served as such Captain from early in the spring of 1778 until peace took place, as he has always understood from his said father and other persons, and that he believes the same to be true. This declarant further states that his father the said Henry Miller died at his residence in the County of Montgomery in said State on the 25th day of April 1855, and left him surviving no widow but one son, viz John J. Miller, this declarant and that he is now the only surviving child of the said Henry miller and Margaret Miller, deceased, and that he this declarant is of lawful age. (Signed) John J. Miller.
