

Pension Application for Jesse Miller

On the seventh day of November 1820, personally appeared in open Court, the same being a Court of Record, in and for the said County of Rockland—Jesse Miller, aged sixty six years, since last March, being a resident of the town of Haverstraw, in the said County of Rockland, who being first duly sworn according to law, doth on his oath declare, that he served in the Revolutionary war as follows.

That he enlisted as a private soldier in the Army of the United States, in the Revolutionary war, in the year 1776 for during the war, in Capt. William Jackson's Company, in the 44th New York Regt commanded by Col. Henry Levingston was at the Battle of the taking of Burgoyne, and at the battle of Monmouth, was placed on the pension list as a Revolutionary Soldier on the Eleventh day of April 1818, and that his Pension Certificate in numbered (4476)—

And I do solemnly swear that I was a resident citizen of the United States on the 18th day of March one thousand eight hundred and eighteen, and that I have not since that time, by gift, sale, or in any manner whatever disposed of my property, or any part thereof, with intent thereby so to diminish it (as to bring myself within the provisions of an Act of Congress entitled "An act to provide for certain persons engaged in the land and naval service of the United States in the Revolutionary War" passed on the 18th of March 1818, and that I have not, nor has any person in trust for me, an property, or securities, contracts or debts other than what is contained in the schedule hereto annexed and by me subscribed.

And this deponent further saith that he is now by age and infirmity, rendered nearly unable to follow his daily labor, and that his family consists of himself his wife and five children between the ages of fourteen, and four and that I have no income whatever except my small earnings and what I may receive by gratuity.
