

Pension Application for John Miller

Orange County SS.

Be it known, that before me James W. Wilkin Clerk of the County aforesaid personally Appeared John Miller in the within letter mentioned and made oath that he is the identical John Miller who was placed on the pension list agreeable to an act of Congress passed 23rd March 1792.

That he had an original certificate in his possession from the war department.—

That in consequence of the same he has been considered intitled [entitled] to and has received a pension for a number of years past for wounds and disabilities incurred in the service of the United States during the Revolutionary War—

That the certificate is lost or mislaid and that in consequence of his not being able to produce the original certificate or a cobby [copy] thereof his pension has been suspended or withheld untill he can obtain such cobby.
