

Pension Application for Thomas Miller

Greene County SS.

On this thirtieth day of May 1820 personally appeared in the Court of Common Pleas of the County of Greene in the State of New York at an open Court then held at the Court house in the said County the same being a Court of Record which proceeds according to the court of the Common Law with Jurisdiction unlimited in point of amount keeping a record of their proceedings, Thomas Miller aged 57 years resident in The Town of Coxsackie County and State aforesaid who being first duly sworn according to law doth on his oath declare that he served in the Revolutionary War as follows:

That he enlisted in the City of Albany in the State of New York in the spring of 1778 or 1779 for during the war in the company commanded by Capt. Van Horne of Foot in the Regiment commanded by Col. VanSchaick of the New York line and that he continued to serve in the said Corps or in the service of the United States until the end of the war, when he as regularly discharged—

That the original declaration made by him as dated on or about the 20th day of November 1819 and that his pension certificate is numbered 16455:

And I do solemnly swear that I was a resident citizen of the United States on the 18th day of March 1818; and that I have not since that time by gift sale or in any manner disposed of my property or any part thereof with intent thereby so to diminish it as to bring myself within the provisions of an act of Congress entitled "an act to provide for certain persons engaged In the land and naval service of the United States in the Revolutionary War" passed on the 18th day of March 1818; and that I have not nor has any person in trust for me any property or securities, contracts or debts due to me; nor have I any income other than what is contained in the Schedule hereto annexed and by me subscribed. My necessary bedding and clothing excepted.

And the said Thomas Miller farther states that he is by occupation a daily laborer and able to pursue it as far as his age will permit but not in such a manner as to support himself and family; that his family residing with him consists of a wife aged 56 years and four children. The oldest a daughter aged 22 years, the next a daughter aged twenty one years. The next a son aged two years the next a son aged 5 months,

and that they are not in a capacity to contribute to his support. (Signed with his mark) Thomas Miller
