

Pension Application for John Mills

On this fifth Day of May 1818 before me the Subscriber one of the Judges of the Court of Common Pleas for the County of Washington & State of Ohio, personally appeared John Mills aged seventy five years of age, resident in Marietta, County & State aforesaid who being by me first Duly Sworn according to law Doth on his oath make the following Declaration in order to obtain the provision made by the late act of Congress entitled “an act to provide for certain persons ingaged [engaged] in the land & naval service of the United States in the United States in the revolutionary war”.

That he the said John Mills enlisted into the army of the United States in AD 1777 on the 24th Day of September on Lake George at Sunday Point (So called) in the State of New York in the Company Commanded by Captain John Wood, in Col. Painters Regiment of Artificers.

That he was enlisted for during the war that he thinks he was three years in service in that regiment that he was then Draled [Drafted] into Col. Baldwins regiment of artificers, that he continued to serve the United States until some time in June AD 1782, that at that time he went home on furlough—the furlough countersigned by Captain Patton, that he never afterwards was called into service in consequence of the peace taking place.

That he is in reduced circumstances, & stands in need of the assistance of his Country for support & that he has no other evidence now in his power of his said services. (Signed) John Mills
