

**Pension Application for James Mason**

James Mason a citizen of this County and a soldier in the Revolution appeared in Court and produced a Schedule of his property amounting to \$0.75 and having sworn thereto it was ordered to be recorded which places in these words to wit:

Schedule

District of Kentucky Owen County SS.

On this 11<sup>th</sup> day of November 1822 personally appeared in open court being a Court of record (so made by the laws of Kentucky and having the power of fine and imprisonment) for said County James Mason aged 95 years resident in Avon County aforesaid being first duly sworn according to law doth on his oath declare that he served in the Revolutionary War as follows, that he enlisted in the year 1777 in Captain Flemings Company in Colonel Heatles Regiment being the Seventh Virginia in which he served three years he was in the Battle of Brandywine and was wounded there, that he was regularly discharged from said Regiment that he is illiterate and did not obtain his discharge in writing that he soon after his discharge enlisted again in the Second Regiment of Yorkers in the year in Captain James Gaudiverts [Gansevoort?] Regiment in which he served three years and obtained a regular discharge therefrom, that he again enlisted at Albany New York in the train of Artillery, Captain Andrew Moodys Company in Colonel Lambs Regiment from Ullrich at the close of the war he was regularly discharged and I do solemnly swear that I was a resident citizen of United States on the 18<sup>th</sup> of March 1818 and that I have not since that time by gift, sale or in any other manner disposed of my property or any part thereof with intent thereby so to diminish it as to bring myself within the provisions of an act of Congress entitled an act to provide for certain persons engaged in the land and naval service of the United States in the Revolutionary War passed 18<sup>th</sup> day of march 1818 and that I have not nor has any person in trust for me any property or securities contracts orders due to me nor have I any income other than what is contained in the Schedule hereto annexed and by me subscribed.

One Knife 0.50

One Tobacco Box 0.25 amounting in the whole to Seventy five cents: (Signed with his mark) James Mason

That I have no occupation but that of daily labor which I am totally unable to pursue, that I have no family all being dead.

Sworn and declared on this 11<sup>th</sup> day of November 1822 before Henry Davidge, Circuit Judge.
