

Pension Application for Francis Monty

R.7317 (Died 1818)

At a Circuit Court held at the Court House in the village of Plattsburgh in and for the County of Clinton in the 4th day of July 1846, the same being a Court of Record.

Present: Hon John Willard Circuit Judge, William Hedding Jr., Douglass Woodward and Isaac H. Putschen, Judges of Said County.

It was proven to the satisfaction of said Court that Francis Monty was a Revolutionary Soldier of the United States, and that he died at the Town of Plattsburgh in the said County of Clinton on the 10th day of August 1818. That he left no widow, that he left six children who are all over the age of Twenty one years and that they are his only Surviving Children whose names are as follows. Christopher Monty, Abram Monty, Betsey Ward, Fanny Miller, Barbara Monty, and Margaret Frederic.

The data which follow in regard to Francis Monty were obtained from the papers in pension claim, R.7317 based upon his service in the Revolutionary War.

Francis Monty was the eldest son of Lieutenant Francis Monty whose record was furnished you above. The date and place of his birth and name of his mother were not stated.

Francis Monty served as private during the Revolutionary War in Captain Olivia's company, in Colonel Moses Hazen's Continental Regiment, and was discharged at the end of the war at Pompton near Fishkill, New York.

The soldier died at Plattsburgh, Clinton County, New York, August 10, 1818. He left no widow but was survived by six children, whose names were as follows, the name of his wife not being given: Christopher, Abram and Barbara Monty, Betsey War, Fanny Miller and Margaret Frederic.

Christopher Monty, soldier's son, while living in Plattsburgh, New York, applied August 15, 1846 for pension which might have been due on account of the services of his father, Francis Monty, in the Revolution. He applied in behalf of himself and the other heirs named above. The claim was not allowed as their father died prior to the Act of June 7, 1832, the act under which they applied for pension.

Francis Monty's brother, Joseph Monty, served with him in the Revolution and in 1864 was a resident of Chazy, Clinton County, New York. The name of one Robert Miller was shown in the claim, but his relationship to soldier's daughter, Fanny Miller, was not stated. This office has no further information relative to Francis Monty, or to his family.
