Revolutionary Claims. Treasury Department. 1 July 1828.

Benjamin Mooers, of Plattsburgh, in the County of Clinton, in the State of New York, has applied to the Secretary of the Treasury for the benefits of the act, entitled "An Act for the relief of certain surviving officers and soldiers of the army of the Revolution," approved on the 15th of May, 1828. He states that he was as an officer on the Continental line, and served as such to the end of the war, at which period he was a Lieutenant in Hazen's regiment of the [blank] line; and that he received commutation certificates for the five years full pay granted by the resolve of 22 March, 1788; and, further, that he has received as a pensioner since the 3d of March, 1826, nothing.

The Third Auditor is requested to report ho far these several statements are corroborated by the records in his office.
