King Moore of the Town of Westmoreland in the County & State aforesaid being duly sworn deposed & saith, that he resides in Westmoreland aforesaid.

That he served as a private souldier [soldier] and as a Gunner in the war of the Revolution in the Army of the United States on the Continental Establishment, during the period of three years & seven months that he was enlisted by John White a Sergeant in Captain Henry Burbick's Company at West Point in the State of New yOrk sometime in the month of November one thousand seven hundred and seventy nine and that he was discharged at West Point, aforesaid on the tenth day of June one thousand seven hundred & eighty three by reason of the having ended.

That he enlisted to serve during the war—that during all the said war he served—that he was enlisted as a private. That during the whole of said time he served as a private & as a gunner in Captain Burbick's company in Colonel John Crain's Regiment of the Artillery in the Massachusetts line. That this deponent had a regular honorable discharge which he has lost & cannot find the same. This deponent further saith that he is now, fifty six years of age and that by reason of his reduced circumstances in life he is in need of assistance from his country for support. (Signed)
